## 2025 dates and deadlines - what works for you?

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, 2021 saw the movement of the previous January 15 deadline to the final Wednesday of January. In tandem with this, reject by default (RBD) and decline by default (DBD) deadlines were also consolidated and moved.

Following your feedback, a focused consultation is proposed to test with the sector whether the current dates and deadlines are still fit for

purpose or need to be revised, with outcomes being implemented for the 2025 entry cycle.

1. Encourage applicants to link to the correct qualification type before entering as free text in the Education section.
2. Students can search by country name for qualifications.
3. IB applicants should give IB permission to send their results to UCAS.
4. Students should use their personal email address as their primary contact in the Hub so they do not miss out on application updates during school holidays.
